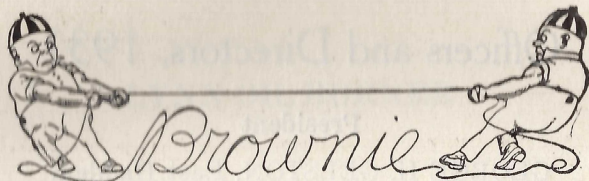

To those coming from the west side of the river, cross the bridge at East Haddam and take the Hadlyme-Norwich roads. At Smith's Corners, turn to the north toward Moodus, and go one-half mile to the Fair Grounds. Any one coming from the direction of Hadlyme, turn to the same place. From Moodus Center take the road leading south past the park. The Fair Grounds are one mile south of Moodus Center. Prominent road signs will be seen from all directions.

All entries of live stock, grain and vegetables are requested to be made with the Secretary on or before Wednesday, September 2. If only one exhibit in a class, second money and first ribbon will be given.

Exhibitors of registered stock must present registration papers on request.

Tested cattle only will be allowed on the Fair Grounds. The State Agricultural Department will advance no state aid money should we allow both tested and untested cattle to compete. Therefore the Association has decided to allow only tested cattle on the Fair Grounds.

All exhibits except live stock must be left until the closing of the Fair.

Chairman of committees are requested to deliver the awards of premiums to the Secretary at or before 4:00 P. M. on day of Fair.

The Treasurer and Secretary will be in their office from 9:00 A. M. to 11:00 A. M., and from 2:00 P. M. to 4:30 P. M., during day of Fair.

All premium slips may be presented to the Treasurer for payment after 2:00 P. M. on day of Fair.

Any premium slips not presented for payment before October 1 will be considered as donated to the Association.

Worthy exhibits only will be considered by the Judges.

No sale of Exhibits on the day of Fair.

All articles, except live stock, must be brought to the hall on Wednesday, September 2. A watchman will care for them overnight.

Any articles offered for sale at the Sales table will be considered as donated to the Association and full proceeds from such sales to be turned into the Association.

To avoid traffic and parking congestion the Association has arranged to devote a large portion of land for automobile parking. Your car will be given ample parking space with room for driving in and out, thus avoiding any mishaps. A watchman will be in continual attendance and the parking space will be so arranged that there will be no confusion in getting in or out of the grounds. In providing parking space for automobiles the Association assumes no responsibility as to loss or damage, but will endeavor to give all patrons of the parking space careful attention.

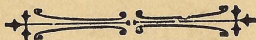
